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The program has an emphasis on sports medicine and private practice management. We do see a variety of cases, including forefoot and rearfoot reconstruction, TAR, arthroscopy, and some trauma and limb salvage. Good exposure to podiatry cases that you would generally see in a private office/outpatient setting. Primarily elective cases.

How many days per week do you typically spend in the OR? In clinic? Do you have your own "fellow" clinic?

We spend about 2.5 days in the OR, and the rest of the time in clinic. We have designated times in the week for a fellow clinic, where we see our own patients, learn billing/coding.



How many surgical cases do you typically scrub per month?

~35 cases

Encouraged to attend all fellow courses, educational workshops, and conferences. Attended about 5-6 of these courses.
