

Want to Access JFAS Online?



 Y ou're not alone – JFAS is the highest-rated member benefit; the most commonly accessed area of the ACFAS website. In fact, accessing this site is the most frequently asked question of our members. The Journal of Foot and Ankle Surgery (JFAS) is the official peer-reviewed scientific journal of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons.

All ACFAS Resident Members receive a hard-copy subscription to JFAS as a benefit of membership. Resident and Student Club Members have full access to an online version of JFAS with new issues posted on the date of publication, as well as archived issues from 1995 to the present.

How do I access JFAS online? It's easy:

- 1) Log into the ACFAS website: www.acfas.org
- 2) Go to the JFAS landing page on the ACFAS website: http://www.acfas.org/jfas/
- 3) Click on the link in the right margin: 'Read current and past issues online"
- 4) You are now on the JFAS site. Since you already logged into the ACFAS website, there is no need to log into the JFAS site again.
- 5) Read the current issue, or search for archived articles.

The College Offers Access to a Whole Library of Podcasts

Students: are you Gearing up for Residency? If you want to get answers about what to do in preparation, check out ACFAS' podcast just for students, Gearing up for Residency. After all, this could be the most important transition in your professional life!

Gearing up for Residency features ACFAS members who serve as Residency Directors for teaching hospitals and schools across the United States. They've been in your shoes before; they've had the same hopes and fears that you may have, and they want to help you. Here are some of the topics they discuss and debate in this free podcast:

- 1. Selecting the right residency program. Learn the importance of and methods for evaluating each program's strengths, weaknesses and surgical emphases. Also, listen to the discussion on what these members say you can do to position yourself as a strong candidate for selection.
- 2. The importance of externships and utilizing them to determine whether or not a residency program is a good fit for you. Along with this topic, should you determine where your externship, residency and training take place based on where your family and friends are, where you'd like to "set up shop" afterward, or where you're going to get the best training and the greatest opportunity?
- 3. What is the best way for a student to research a program and at what point in school should this be done? Then, after choosing a program, how should you prepare during the time leading up to beginning your residency? Is there anything specific you can read in order to prepare for the upcoming residency challenge?

- 4. Have fun! Residency Directors recommend social activities that can teach you more about what you should expect when entering your residency.
- 5. What are some ways incoming residents can prepare for actual surgical skills? If you think your skills are pretty great but you are unsure of what Residency Directors will think of your other qualities, learn how you can show that you'll make a good resident as these residency program directors weigh in on which qualities they look for in future residents.
- 6. An externship can make or break your chances of getting into a good residency. Listen to what to do and what not to do during your externship.
- 7. If you're unable to visit a residency program, find out which questions you need to ask to gather information so you can determine whether or not the program will be a good fit for you.
