Typically, half day clinic, half day in surgery. I do have my own clinic schedule and see new patients, post-op patients, etc.

There is a lot of opportunity for research including being involved in randomized trials at the clinic. The fellow has access to data to aid in research as it is uniquely situated within a large podiatry group.

Take hospital call about every 6-8 weeks - see trauma (Ex: ankle, calc fx), infection Take call for the office

Journal club and Presentations are held twice a month. Cadaver labs, opportunities to be involved with the Bethesda residency program
