


Save the Date for ACFAS 75

"We had great turnout for the lecture and lab, and I was pleased to





Submit Your Student Club Research Posters for ACFAS 75

Student Clubs, showcase your research and be part of ACFAS history by submitting a scientific or case study poster to ACFAS 75, scheduled for February 27–March 2 in Las Vegas.

Submission requirements are as follows:

- Scientific format posters accepted for presentation at ACFAS 75 must be sent in both paper and PDF format.
- Poster size should not exceed 3.5 feet high x 7.5 feet wide.
- Only one ACFAS Student Club poster entry is accepted from each school. Student Club entries are to be a group effort, not an individual submission.

- Faculty members may not be listed as authors or coauthors of a Student Club poster.
- Posters with students listed as primary authors will not be accepted for display.
- At least one of the poster authors must register for and attend ACFAS 75 for their poster to be displayed.

Student Club poster abstracts are due November 1, 2016. Poster PDFs are due January 16, 2017.
