Facing the Challenge

Speaker: Ted Kennedy, Jr.



If there's someone who understands the American healthcare system, it's Ted Kennedy, Jr. Since losing one of his legs to bone cancer in 1973 at the age of 12, Kennedy has devoted much of his professional and personal energy to working as an advocate for the civil rights of people with disabilities. In addition, his spouse is a physician, and his father's 47-year career in the U.S. Senate was dedicated to healthcare access for all Americans.

His topic is “Facing the Challenge,” and will probe the issues that come into play when today's physicians strive to provide compassionate, optimal patient-focused care.

Kennedy has served as the executive director of Facing the Challenge, a non-profit advocacy and public policy office on disability-related issues, as a teaching fellow on disability policy at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, and as an attorney fighting for the rights of persons with disabilities. In addition, he has worked extensively with both policy-makers and the corporate world in the areas of expanding job opportunities for people with disabilities.

In addition to his work in the area of disability law, Kennedy also focuses on health care law, and advises numerous hospitals and pharmaceutical, biotechnology, and medical device companies on reimbursement and regulatory issues facing those industries. He is currently president of the Marwood Group, healthcare-focused investment bank. A graduate of Wesleyan University, Yale University, and the University of Connecticut School of Law, Kennedy spends much of his time studying environmental factors that lead to disease and disability. Since 1992, he has worked on the research faculty of the Yale University School of Medicine.

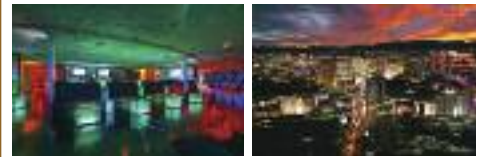

Learning OBJECTIVES

Attendees of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons Annual Scientific Conference will be able to:

Treat and manage forefoot, midfoot and rearfoot pathology. This includes the etiology and the clinical assessment of the various pathologies and the selection of a variety of surgical procedures and potential clinical outcomes. 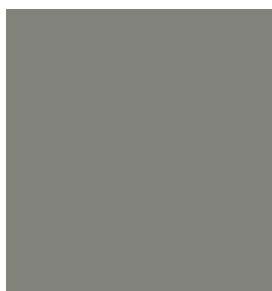
